AMATEUR RULES & REGULATIONS

GENERAL AMATEUR RULES

- All amateur events are sanctioned by CDF and recognized by NDCC
- All amateur competitors dancing in sanctioned events may be required to be registered with NDCC and may need a membership.
- Entry fees must be paid with registration to be considered valid
- Organizers reserve the right to cancel or combine events due to insufficient entries
- All syllabus events will be invigilated. For more information about syllabus please see: www.dancecouncil.ca
- Schedule subject to change. Please check www.dancesportgrandprix.com for current updates to the TENTATIVE schedule
- All competitors require an evening admission ticket for the day(s) their events are held. Sunday competitors will require a daytime admission ticket.
- There is a \$5 refundable deposit for competition numbers. Please have cash ready when picking up your numbers at registration desk
- Placement medals will be awarded to the Top 3 finalists in each event.
- Placement medals will be awarded to the Top 6 finalists in each Juvenile and Junior category
- UNDER 21 may compete in Adult

DRESS CODE

- Please see www.dancecouncil.ca for Dress Code Rules
- Every amateur competitor must follow the Dress Code according to their age division and category level, as per *Appendix III – Dress Code Regulations*
- Any violation of the Dress Code Regulations as set forth in *Appendix III – Dress Code Regulations* can be penalized. The penalty is entirely left to the discretion of the Chairman of Judges. The penalty shall account for the severity and occurrence of the violation of the Dress Code Regulations.
- Inappropriate costumes are not acceptable.

PAYMENT, LATE ENTRY and REFUND POLICY
EARLY BIRD PRICE DEADLINE: September *, 2018

- **Please include payment of entry fees with your registration. Registration will not be considered valid otherwise. All competitors require evening admission tickets for the day(s) they are dancing. Competitors dancing on Sunday will required a Sunday daytime ticket.**

- Late entries will only be accepted at the discretion of the organizer and are subject to a \$25 late fee
- The organizer has the right to cancel any event.
- There are no refunds on registration or tickets purchased

WAIVER & LIABILITY

- All amateurs (and, if under age 18, their parents or legal guardians) must sign the release on the entry/summary form to be eligible to compete.

AGE CLASSIFICATION - 2018:

The following age classifications are based upon the individual's birthday which occurs within the calendar year

- (a) **JUVENILE I:** 9 years old or less
- (b) **JUVENILE II:** 10 or 11 years old
- (c) **JUNIOR:** 12-15 years old
- (d) **UNDER 21:** 16-20 years old
- (e) **ADULT:** 16+ years old and older
- (f) **SENIOR I:** 30 years and older. Both members should be 30 years and older
- (g) **SENIOR II:** 40 years and older. Both members should be 40 years old and over

Juvenile I-II, Junior, Under 21 and Adult (16+) Categories

- The Age Division is determined by the age of the oldest couple's member
- A Juvenile couple registered in their division Juvenile I or Juvenile II is permitted to also dance in the Junior age division
- A Junior couple registered in their age division is permitted to dance in the Under 21 age division, however may not dance in the Adult (16+) division.

SENIOR I and II Categories

- For Senior I and Senior II, both members of the couple must meet the age requirements in the calendar year
